The Johnson Ohana Charitable Foundation is a non-profit public charity founded in 2008 by Kim and Jack Johnson to promote positive and lasting change within communities by supporting organizations that focus on environmental, art, and music education.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS

In 2015, the Johnson Ohana Charitable Foundation continued to support plastic free initiatives and sustainable local food systems. Jack and Kim Johnson took part in the 5 Gyres SEA Change research expedition and youth summit in the Bahamas, to raise awareness about solutions to plastic ocean pollution. Grant funding supported the SEA Change Youth Summit, which brought together 75 students to participate in hands-on activities and action projects.

In addition to environmental grantmaking, the Johnson Ohana Charitable Foundation continued to support art and music education for youth, including Art Explorium's Creative Reuse Open House for Teachers which weaves together art and sustainability to promote reuse activities for students.
