OUR MISSION

The Johnson Ohana Charitable Foundation is a non-profit public charity founded in 2008 by Jack and Kim Johnson to promote positive and lasting change within communities by supporting organizations that focus on environmental, art, and music education.

2011 HIGHLIGHTS

Since 2008, the Johnson Ohana Charitable Foundation's specific funding theme has focused on supporting sustainable local food systems, including school & community gardens, nutrition education, and farm to school initiatives. Grants also continue to support plastic free initiatives, healthy oceans, and environmental education. Wrapping up Jack Johnson's "To The Sea" tour donations, over \$61,000 was directed to *All At Once* Non-Profit Partners in Australia and New Zealand.

In 2011, support for youth music and arts education grew, including grants for school and community based music and arts programs, and purchase of instruments and art supplies. Including *All At Once* donations, a grant total of \$239,910 was distributed to non-profit organizations in 2011.
